

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER
Monitoring Requirements Not Met for
Clarendon Co W&S HWY 260 (SC1450013)

Our water system violated a drinking water standard over the past year. Even though this was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct these situations.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During **January and February 2022**, we **did not monitor** for **chlorine residual** with our monthly bacteriological samples.

What This Means

There is nothing you need to do at this time. The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for, how often we are supposed to sample for it and how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were taken.

Contaminant	Required sampling frequency	Number of samples taken	When all samples should have been taken	When samples were or will be taken
Residual chlorine analysis for bacteriological sample	3 per month	0 out of 3	January 2022	Samples will be collected, analyzed for chlorine residual, and submitted to SC DHEC accordingly going forward
Residual chlorine analysis for bacteriological sample	3 per month	0 out of 3	February 2022	Samples will be collected, analyzed for chlorine residual, and submitted to SC DHEC accordingly going forward

Steps We are Taking

We are currently working with SC DHEC to resolve the issue and return to compliance. Our sample collectors have revised their Standard Operating Procedures to ensure that the proper analysis takes place each month.
